GREEN FOR SENSORY DISABILITIES

RED-GREEN COLOUR-BLINDNESS IS THE MOST COMMON VISION DIFFERENCE IN THE WORLD. DEAF AND HARD OF HEARING ARE ALSO INCLUDED HERE

BLUE FOR MENTAL HEALTH

ASSOCIATED WITH THE MIND AND DEPRESSION, THE COLOUR BLUE REPRESENTS PSYCHOSOCIAL DIFFERENCES



WHITE FOR INVISIBLE OR UNDIAGNOSED

MOST DISABILITIES ARE UNDIAGNOSED OR INVISIBLE AT SOME TIME

GOLD FOR NEUROLOGY

AU IS THE SYMBOL FOR GOLD, SO THIS COLOUR REPRESENTS AUTISM, INTELLECTUAL DISABILITY AND OTHER DIVERSE BRAINS



RED FOR PHYSICAL DISABILITIES

ASSOCIATED WITH FLESH AND BLOOD, THIS COLOUR REPRESENTS PHYSICAL DISABILITIES SUCH AS LIMB DIFFERENCE AND SPINAL CORD INJURY.

CLEARLY WE ARE A DIVERSE MINORITY! PARALLEL LINES CLOSE TOGETHER REPRESENT BEING UNITED IN PRIDE
